



Travel Tracer

The role of the Travel Tracer is to keep track of where events in the book take place.

When you are reading a book in which characters move around often and the scene changes frequently, it is important for everyone in your group to know where things are happening and how the setting may have changed. That's your job: carefully track where the action takes place during your reading. Describe each setting in detail, either in words or with an action map or diagram. Also, always give the page locations where the scene is described.

Success Criteria:

- 1. You have identified where the events in the reading have taken place.*
- 2. You have described the location, or setting, in detail.*
- 3. You have created a timeline or 'map' of where the events happen, including identifying the page where the location of the action changes.*

Going Beyond:

- Draw a picture of the setting for a section of the story.*
